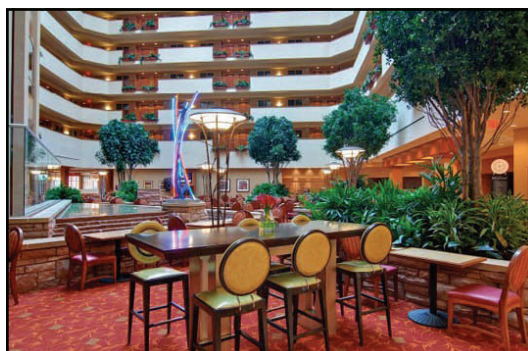

SESSION 1: FRIDAY AFTERNOON, APRIL 29, 2011**1:00 PM - 2:30 PM, Presentation****1. Processing Schedules Revisited (1.5 CEU credit hours)**

Ada T. Feldman, MS, HT/HTL(ASCP)CM

Many artifacts seen in a stained slide (e.g., blue halo, bubbly nuclei, separation, shrinkage) are due to poor processing. While good fixation is essential in preparing tissue sections, proper dehydration, clearing and infiltration can also play a significant role. Discussion will concentrate on how to modify processing schedules in order to eliminate such artifacts in light of time constraints, reagents and modern processors.

The practice of insect histology presents unique technical challenges and is a relatively esoteric specialty in the overall field of histotechnology. This seminar will present an historical survey of the specialty, review the basic concepts of insect morphology, discuss protocols, and provide an overview of how histotechnology is currently playing a vital role in advancing the understanding of insect morphology and physiology.

Organizations large and small are beginning to take a closer look at their impact on the environment. Histology utilizes instrumentation and many reagents and consumables to achieve its goal in saving life. This workshop is an exercise to provide possibilities to improving procedures and processes using 3 steps: Determine what are we using in our laboratories, assess the rules and regulations that govern the ways and means to rid laboratories of its waste and assess cost savings, efficiencies, and environmental friendly means in achieving the laboratories goals. The results of this workshop will lead to new practices in histology and new ways to advance histotechnology. This workshop has the potential to generate laboratory changes to transform the relationship between earth and lab achieving a goal of truly saving life.

4. Let's Be Civil! How Considerate Conduct Impacts the Workplace (3.0 CEU credit hours)

Have you ever been frustrated because someone didn't return your phone call or respond to your email? Have you heard negative remarks made by a co-worker about another colleague? These actions, and many others that we consider rudeness or poor manners, are in the category of incivility. Many medical schools are incorporating civility courses for their students, as a result of inconsiderate and disruptive actions by students and faculty over the years. This workshop will define civility and incivility, as well as discuss how we can model and encourage considerate conduct in the workplace.

5. Bar Coding, the New Frontier to Ensuring Positive Patient Identification in Histology Lab (1.0 CEU credit hour)

Using bar-coding technology to ensuring positive patient identification throughout the entire Histology process. Tracking the process from accessioning, grossing, embedding, microtomy, collation into the Pathologist office for microscopic evaluation. *Note: this presentation is 60 minutes and will conclude at 11:00 AM.*

6. Troubleshooting Hematoxylin and Eosin Staining (3.0 CEU credit hours)

Ada Feldman MS, HT/HTL(ASCP)CM

Hematoxylin and eosin is the primary diagnostic stain in anatomical pathology. However, tissue processing and staining procedure steps all affect the H&E's final appearance, potentially interfering with diagnosis. Topics will include smudgy nuclei, aberrant staining, "soap suds" artifact, haziness, etc. along with corrective actions for each.

7. Antibody Challenge (3.0 CEU credit hours)

George Hoernig HT(ASCP) QIHC

Regulatory agencies are now requiring the validation of new antibodies, protocols, and platforms. This seminar will help to prepare participants with the tools and documentation they need to develop an adequate validation protocol. We will examine current CAP and CLIA regulations as well as ASCO/CAP recommendations. Validation protocols should contain an adequate number of positive and negative cases, and determining that number can be difficult. Certain regulatory agencies require a prescribed number of cases to be validate and concordance recorded to become certified to run FDA Approved tests (Her-2-Neu), while other procedures are left to the discretion of the Laboratory Director. The seminar will also cover the difference between optimization and validation and the need to validate concentrated as well as ready to use antibodies as well as the detection reagents.

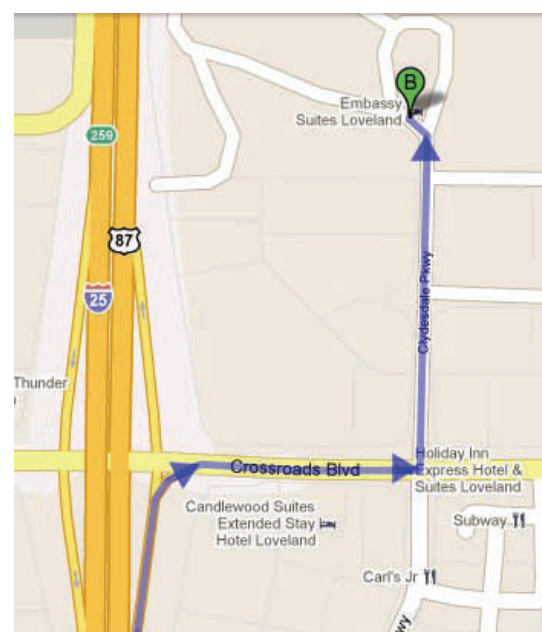
MAPS & DIRECTIONS
